**iii. Progress made under Flagship Schemes/ Programmes including large projects of the department during the month:**

**Bengal Silicon Valley:** The State has set up Bengal Silicon Valley as a world class state of art IT Hub in an area of **170 acres** of land of WBHIDCO in Action Area II, New Town, Kolkata. 65.085 acres land is already allotted to 4 nos. organizations, 55.634 acres land is under different stages of evaluation and allotment.

- **Launching Year** – 2018
- **Outcome** – The expected outcomes of the project are creating IT jobs in Kolkata and make Kolkata a popular destination for the IT industry. Bengal Silicon Valley is expected to garner 3000 Cr. investment in 5 years generating 20000 IT/ITeS jobs.

**IT/Hardware PARKS-Physical Infrastructure:18 IT Parks** and 1 Hardware Park are operational throughout the State including Tier-II and Tier III cities, viz. Durgapur (Ph-I&II), Siliguri (Ph-I, II & III), Kharagpur, Asansol, Bolpur, Haldia, Taratala, Howrah, Kalyani (Ph-I), Rajarhat (Ph-I), Barjora, Purulia, Malda, Krishnanagar, Kalimpong (rented space) and Sonarpur Hardware Park. The average occupancy is 70% [100% for 1: Kalyani (Ph-I)]for the IT Parks as on **31.03.2021**.

4 (four) new IT Parks are presently under construction. 2(two) of them are at Sector- V (at plot nos. BN-9 & BN-4), 1 (one) at Rajarhat (Ph-II) and 1 (one) at Kalyani (Ph-II). Average 99% of civil construction works and average of 85 % services work completed till **31.03.2021**

2 Electronics Manufacturing Clusters (EMC) are under construction at Naihati&Falta. Boundary wall 100 % completed, overall average 80 % of basic infrastructure works (*gates, roads, drainage, UGR, pump house, sub-station etc.*) overall average 45 % of common facility building work and overall average 55 % of electrical infrastructure works completed for both the EMCs.

DPR, duly vetted by PWD,for the following proposed projects have already been placed to the Department for administrative approval. The same approval has not yet been accorded:-

- **5 (five)** proposed new IT Parks viz. Durgapur (Ph-III), Plot BN-6 at Sector-V, Belur, Kalimpong & Darjeeling.

Engg. Consultant selection process completed for these IT Parks except for Durgapur Ph-III IT Park which has been under process. Subsequently, as advised by the IT & E Dept., all activities towards the Kalimpong& Darjeeling IT Parks have been kept on hold. In the recent

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past, as desired by the IT & E Dept. for proposed BN-6 IT Park, phasing of expenditure details sent for according administrative approval.

- 1 (one) Hardware Park at Kalyani.
- 1(one) IT Innovation Centre at plot DP-6/1 in Sector-V.Engg. Consultant selection process completed for this project.

Moreover, as advised during review meetings at the Department, DPR has been prepared for Phase-IV IT Park at Siliguri and will soon be placed to the Dept. for approval. Also, regarding the proposed 5 acre plot of Webel within Bengal Silicon Valley Hub for the proposed “IT Hub & Start Up-----Centre of Excellence” project, process initiated for preparation of DPR. Land allotment letter issued by HIDCO and fund requisition for land placed to the IT & E Dept. Further, proposal for Asansol IT Park (Ph-II) has also been placed to the Dept. for in principle approval.

- **Outcome**-Total nos. of IT Enterprise (IT/ITeS/ IT Support) is 268, total no. of direct employment is 3975 nos. and approx. 19875 nos. indirect employment (approximately 5 times above the direct employment as per NASSCOM Study) **as on 31.03.2021.**

**Cyber Security- Centre of Excellence:** Inaugurated and operational from November 2017. CS-CoE portal was launched on 16 March 2018. CS-CoE consists of 5 verticals such as (i) Capacity Building & Awareness Generation, (ii) Cyber Security Assurance, (iii) Security Operation Centre, (iv) Cyber Forensic & Investigation and (v) Research& Development and Advisory.

#### **Activities and Outcome up to 31.03.2021**

- **First Responder Training (FRT)** on Cybercrime Response for Police Personnel of West Bengal successfully completed for **520** police officials.
- **Cyber Security Orientation Training (CSOT)** -**683** direct recruited Police personnel trained.
- **Online training of police personnel on CDR/IPDR forensic tools** - **18** Police officials from various **Cyber Crime PS** participated.
- **Cyber Forensic preparatory training for CID Officials of WB Police** - **12** Police officials participated.
- **On the Job Training (OJT)** 11 Departments- UD&MA, Tourism, HIDCO, Science and Technology, Environment, Technical Education Training and Skill Development. Webel, WTL, Judicial, Labour, WBBSE including Office of District Magistrate Darjeeling, Kalimpong and Siliguri Mahakuma Parishad- **1700** employees got trained.
- **Awareness Generation Program:** Till date a total of **4628** participants attended various Cyber Awareness programs organised by the CS-CoE.
- **Cyber Swadhinata Programme**—It is an online awareness generation programme on **Cyber Incident & Detection** for state government officials. It witnessed successful passing out of **193** officials of the State Government.
- **Cyber Shikshak** - Cyber Security Awareness Training for the teachers of West Bengal: **66** teachers/professors/faculty members participated.
- **ICT Infrastructure Audit:** In process for **14** Departments, completed for **6** Departments.

**Initiated for 82 Govt. establishments**

- **Web Security Audit:** Running for **18** Portals, Completed for **9** web Portals.

**Initiated for 106 Web Portals**

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- On receipt of the POC from **NCIIPC/Cert-In/SIB Kolkata** the CS-CoE informs the same to the owner department to patch up the vulnerabilities. Till now the process is completed for **106** web portals.

### Report on SelfScan for the month of March, 2021

Document Scanner App is something that we need for our personal as well as business purposes on a daily basis. For business critical situations and for faster digital communication, scanning of printed documents has become a common activity in most of the organizations. On personal front as well, we often need soft copy versions of our important documents for various purposes. Besides the desktop scanners which are omnipresent in organizations, there has been a growing need for more portable mechanisms for document scanning. Smart phones and tablets are the two key popular media which can be extensively utilized for such purposes and can actually capture high quality scans of printed documents with their built-in cameras, which makes the process faster and more convenient as compared to a traditional desktop scanner.

There are already a few scanning apps available in android and iOS platforms. However, a few widely used scanning apps raised severe concerns with regard to data security aspects. In the above backdrop, the Department of Information Technology and Electronics, Govt. of West Bengal has come up with an in house Safe Document Scanner (SDS) application which effectively addresses the concerns over data security. The app named, “SelfScan” stores data within the device; however, no data gets stored either within the app or on any server. Keeping data privacy at utmost importance, the SelfScan app does not as well capture any personal data of the user, does not store any cookies, neither it performs any background data collection. The app was launched on 6th July 2020 by the Honourable Chief Minister of West Bengal, Smt. Mamata Bandopadhyay. The app has been developed by the Society for Natural Language Technology Research (SNLTR), Kolkata under the aegis of Department of Information Technology & Electronics, Govt. of West Bengal (DITE, GoWB).

New features of SelfScan

- Document renaming done in an easy way.
- Password protected document.
- Improved shadow removal from scanned document.
- Reduced size of watermark.
- Reduced outline border.
- Add new pages inside the previously scanned document.
- After update app crashes, this bug is fixed now.
- New version of app supports Android 11 also.
- User can save document in reduced size pdf also.
